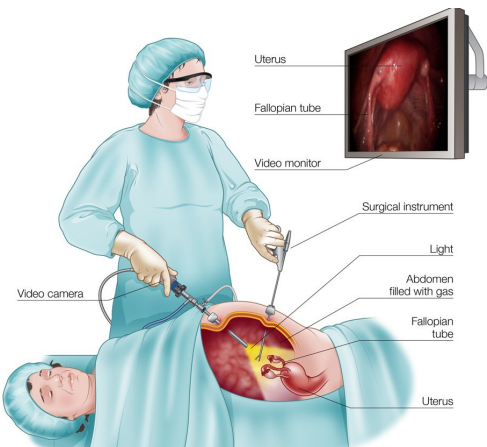


HOW CAN SURGERY TREAT ENDOMETRIOSIS?

Laparoscopy is the most common procedure used to treat Endometriosis. Endometriosis or scar tissue is removed using one of various techniques, including cutting and removing tissue (excision) or destroying it (ablation). Most women have relief from pain after surgery. Up to 30% women may require surgery again within two years.



Surgery is aimed to diagnose, remove of endometriosis, endometriomas (chocolate cysts) and adhesions, to repair any damage caused and to improve fertility. Sometimes bowel or urology specialists, will be involved if there is endometriosis in the bladder or bowel.

Taking oral contraceptive pills or other medications after having surgery may help extend the pain-free period.

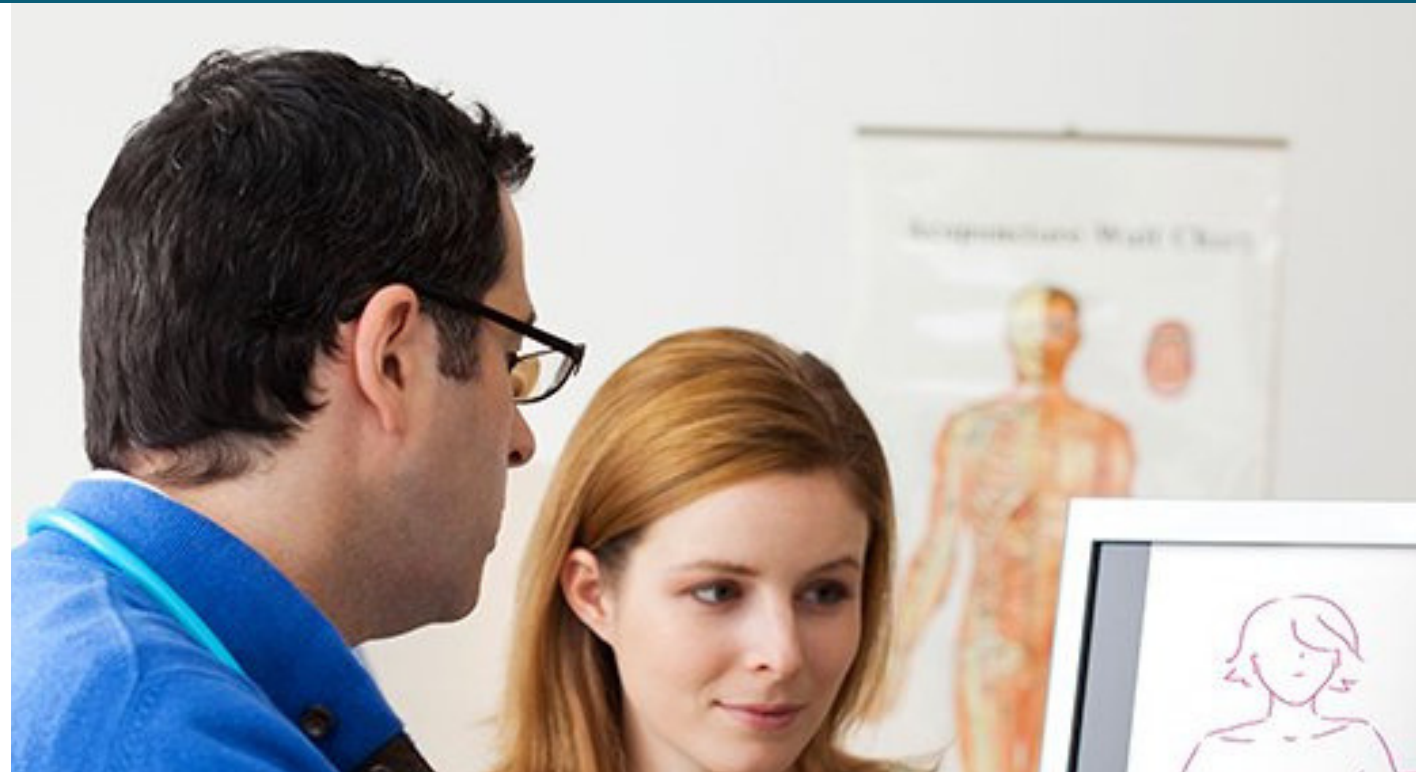
